Our vision is of a world in which children and young people grow up with freedom and dignity in a loving, protective environment, experiencing fulfilled lives whatever their ability.


Our Mission

Eurochild

In the summer of 2018 FARA Charity renewed its membership to Eurochild to join the fight to deinstitutionalise the care system across Europe. Eurochild advocates for children's rights and wellbeing to bring the child or young person to the heart of policy making in Europe, helping to influence policy and promoting the exchange of methodology and research. The link will be very beneficial for FARA and we look forward to working together to support the futures of children and young people in Romania.

DePaul

To kick off our collaboration with leading international homelessness charity DePaul, a team from the charity visited the FARA



Charity social projects in Bucharest to understand the need for homeless services and how FARA currently prevents youth homelessness. As a development coming out of these visits and a subsequent visit early in 2019 a joint pilot programme is being planned to support young people leaving institutions and tackling their needs as they reintegrate into society and learn to lead independent lives.





NEW Rafael Therapy Centre

At the end of 2018 following a successful appeal both in the UK and Romania we opened our new Therapy Centre on the outskirts of Bucharest. Vulnerable children and Families in Poverty

FARA's Social ProjectsFamily HomesTackling Poverty Through Education

FARA's social projects support vulnerable children and families living in poverty in Romania. FARA strives to help keep families together, keep children in school and to give children a loving family life.

Data Point More than 50% of children in Romania suffer from severe deprivation. Opening Doors For Europe's Children Country Factsheet, 2019

Our **Tackling Poverty Through Education** programme runs across **6 schools** in the rural north of Romania and helps **260 children** daily by providing a hot meal, homework and education support and access to visits and experiences showing children that there is a wider world they can be part of. This programme is very successful and the children we support through this scheme go on to pass their grades and successfully enrol into Secondary School setting them on a path out of poverty.

FARA has plans to develop this programme and provide more support for families in the community, giving more access to services that support whole families and **to ultimately keep families together**.

Sadly, sometimes it is not possible for children to stay with their families. FARA's **Family Homes** offer children a chance to live as a family, to be nurtured and supported to lead full lives. The children we care for are normally referred to FARA by Romania's social services when they have been found neglected and living in poverty or sometimes they come from institutions. Extending our family support programme in the rural north will **support families before they get to a crisis situation** and this will help keep more children with their families.

In 2019 we will be appealing for support in the rolling out of this programme to more areas to keep more children with their families and helping keep communities **strong and happy**. We will keep you informed over the year of ways you can help us make this programme a success.



Mihai's story

Mihai lives in a tiny village in the northern Suceava district of Romania. He lives in his grandmother's simple two room house, with his parents and two siblings in one room and his maternal arandmother in the other. Mihai's family have very little money they struggle to afford basic food. His father works seasonally on the land and travels abroad to find work and send money home. Mihai is very lucky as both his parents are supportive and there is a lot of love in their home.

> "The FARA programme is my favourite. Here I learn a lot of new things and I like the food I get here." Mihai, 10 years old.

Mihai is a serious boy who works hard at school and at home, he quietly gets on with the chores he is given before going outside to tinker with his old bicycle which is his most treasured possession and gives him a way of travelling to see friends in neighbouring villages.

Vihai's story is true, however his name has been changed to protect his privacy.

Mihai has an older brother who is at high school and he is keen to follow in his footsteps. With the **kind donations** of our supporters FARA can build the community care and support through the schools and really make a change to the lives of vulnerable children like Mihai.



FARA's Tackling Poverty Through Education programme provides hot meals, homework clubs, and access to social and medical care, all helping to keep families like Mihai's together.



Vulnerable Children and Families In Poverty

FARA's Social Projects Therapy Centres Tackling Poverty Through Education

Families in poverty make up a large proportion of the people supported by the **FARA Family**. In Romania abject poverty affects families and their ability to support and care for their children. FARA works alongside these families, helping them to access **healthcare**, supporting the children in to **school** and enabling parents to go back to **work**.

Data Point

"Poverty and social exclusion persist among young people, families with children, people with disabilities, Roma, the rural population and inactive people" 2017 Eurochild Report on the European Semester

In our **Therapy Centres** families who would otherwise be unable to afford specialist therapy can access **life-changing support**. Parents are given a new lease of life with their children, communication becomes easier, activities can be shared and the whole family unit feels less isolated.

The outreach work FARA plans to develop further through the **Tackling Poverty Through Education** programme will also **help more families** with children with learning difficulties in the rural areas, whose children may need support to attend school or need full-time care at home making it impossible for parents to work and therefore unable to support the family.

"Since 2007 when FARA Foundation opened the first **Therapy Centre** for children with disabilities, 477 children have been helped to reach their maximum potential. Their families received **support** to be or to feel again part of their **community without shame or isolation**. They found the hope they had lost, they felt that they weren't alone in their struggle with the drama they were living. With hard work they received a chance for a normal life. Because of the lack of free therapy services, poor families had no hope of seeing their children supported.

But through the expert free services FARA is offering they can begin to feel confidence in future.

In this moment the charity is running three **Therapy Centres** with 182 children receiving therapy, functioning at full capacity. Each centre has waiting lists for others in need. More and more children, with our help, attend school for the first time."

Children with Disabilities

FARA's Social Projects O Therapy Centres

Children with Disabilities attending one of the FARA **Therapy Centres** are offered the chance of a new life, a **brighter future**; it could mean receiving the right therapy and preschool education to be able to attend a regular school, or simply with the right support to be able to talk and play with other children or crucially, finally having their needs understood and cared for.

The **Therapy Centres** welcome children into the FARA Family and provide physiotherapy, specialist education, speech and sensory therapy, art therapy, family guidance, support in the home and communication with doctors and authorities.

Accessing specialist therapy in Romania for children with disabilities is difficult, **services are scarce**, and many private centres are simply **too expensive** for the average Romanian family. FARA tackles this issue face on with three **Therapy Centres**, **Rafael's** in Bucharest, **St Teresa's** and **The Emanuel Centre** in Suceava County.



Vasile's story – "we have succeeded!"

Vasile was 4 years old when his mother brought him to a FARA **Therapy Centre** two years ago, he was diagnosed with a form of paraplegia, meaning he was unable to move his legs, and his mother had nowhere else to turn.

At the beginning he was resistant to the staff, crying and refusing to take part in the therapy sessions, he only wanted his mother. Soon, thanks to the **kind determination** of the FARA therapists, he was happily sitting on the massage table, enjoying the exercises, smiling all the way through and not wanting to leave. Vasile is now able to communicate how he feels and asks lots of questions.

The **visible joy** a child feels when they succeed is the greatest reward for both the therapist and child. Often Vasile will say "wow, we have succeeded! I've come to the end. Can I do it again?" This helps the children develop a self-confidence which encourages further development and gives them trust that they will **continue to succeed**.

Young Adults at Risk

FARA's Social Projects • Prevention of Youth Homelessness



Data Point

"Institutional care is contributing to creating "lost generations" of young people who are not able to fully integrate into society." United Nations High Commissioner for Human Rights (OHCHR), The rights of vulnerable children under the age of three, 2011

Young adults in our **Prevention of** Youth Homelessness programme are primarily institutionalised care-leavers. When a child reaches the age of 18 they are discharged from the notorious Romanian state institutions and find themselves alone in the world without support, a roof over their head and the life skills to make a future. FARA provides independent life skills and crucial support, helping them find their way.



"Through FARA I have a roof over my head, help for my basic needs, and support for education, formal and informal. But beside these, it has offered hope and belief that I will achieve my goals and the main common goal, becoming independent. I am aware of the efforts made for us.

I hope that this program is able to help as many young people as possible."

At present there are three hostels in the **Prevention of Youth Homelessness** programme, one in Bucharest, and two in the North in Satu Mare and Suceava. As members of the FARA Family the young people in the hostels leave with the **tools to create their own lives**, in the knowledge FARA is always there if they need them.

FARA hopes to **extend** this social programme in order to meet the needs of more young adults. Helping young adults at risk find meaningful employment, live secure independent lives and to **prevent homelessness**.

"All of us want to develop and to rise as high as possible. Often, we fall and no one is around. The lack of opportunities represents difficulties for young people like myself. I lost all my hopes until I found out about FARA. Now, this centre means a lot to me. I am happy that I have a stable job and can plan on my finances.

I am at this stage thanks to the people working with me here at FARA. We have of course our ups and downs, but the misunderstandings go away very quickly. We receive lots of good advice and support. Thank you."



Adults with Learning Disabilities

FARA's Social Projects O Homes for Life



Data Point

The UN Convention on the Rights of Persons with Disabilities requires States to ensure people with disabilities have access to services, 'necessary to support living and inclusion in the community; and to prevent isolation or segregation from the community' Article 19

A childhood of neglect and restraint in the notorious Romanian state institutions has meant the **Adults with Learning Difficulties** in the FARA Family have had their ability to learn and to live an independent life greatly reduced.

The **Homes For Life** offer a loving, supportive family life in a nurturing environment with access to **specialist therapy**, giving them a chance to flourish, helping them to develop their **social, spiritual, emotional and physical wellbeing** to live a fulfilled life as part of the wider community.



Often the adults will need support from the FARA Family for the rest of their lives, however some are able to move back into the community in the knowledge the **FARA Family will always be there** for them should they need it.

Adults living in the FARA **Homes For Life** are given roles and responsibilities, providing them with a feeling of purpose and being part of a working whole.

Unlike in the institutions where they grew up, the adults are encouraged to **get creative** in kitchen, and are given household duties such as feeding the cat, walking the dog.

The residents also participate in pottery, woodwork, painting and traditional craft workshops helping to build a sense of **selfworth and confidence**.



The next planned branch in this part of the FARA Family is the **development of community drop-in centres for vulnerable Adults with Learning Disabilities** living

These centres will provide a **vital lifeline**, helping individuals to be less isolated, make friends and be part of the community.
